Over the past few decades, millions of new immigrants -- from central and south America, southeast Asia, China, Japan and India -- have settled in the United States, spurring debates and anxieties about immigration law, employment, schools and national security. Similar developments have occurred across the nations of the European Union.

What do responses to new immigrants look like today, across these contexts? Do they merely reflect a resurgence of older patterns of 'nativist' hostility, or some new elements? What are the implications of resistance to new immigrants with respect to social policymaking such as education, health and law? What implications do these developments have for the meaning and significance of race and citizenship?
