Yet, over the last century and a half, millions of blacks have immigrated voluntarily from nations around the world, leaving us with different American experiences that do not fit neatly into a narrative of victimization that positions slavery as its starting point. *Neo-African-Americans* explores the contemporary story of black immigration and the broader implications this phenomenon has upon how we understand blackness in America.
