# The Night Malcolm X Spoke at the Oxford Union:

*Racial Protest & the Subversive Special Relationship*

*A Lecture by Professor Stephen Tuck*



**Stephen Tuck** is a university lecturer in American History at the University of Oxford. His research interests include modern race equality struggles in Britain and America, religion and Jim Crow, and historiography. He is the author of two prize-winning books: *We Ain't What We Ought To Be: The Black Freedom Struggle From Emancipation to Obama* (2010) and *Beyond Atlanta: The Struggle for Civil Rights in Georgia, 1940-80* (2003). His most recent book, published earlier this year, is titled *The Fog of War: The Second World War and the Civil Rights Movement* (edited with Kevin Kruse). This year, he is the Sheila Biddle Ford Foundation Fellow at the W.E.B. DuBois Institute for African and African-American Research at Harvard University.

Dr. Tuck's talk will explore the connections between British and American movements for race equality, and the ways in which activists in both countries sought to use these connections for their own purposes.
