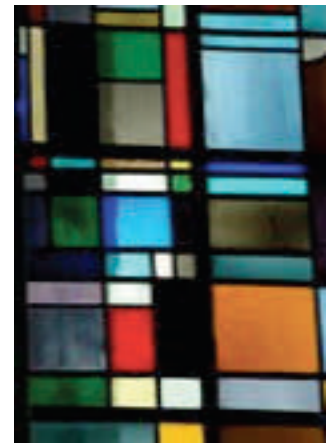


The Center for Race & Ethnicity proudly presents our:
